### Activities of the Association Missionaries of Charity, India

The Missionaries of Charity Sisters give wholehearted and free service to the poorest of the poor irrespective of caste, creed (Religion) or nationality according to the particular needs of the areas in which our houses are located. Such works include:

#### Nursing the destitute, beggars and sick of the streets

- We have 180 Homes all over India in most of the States, caring for the poorest of the poor i.e. abandoned, destitutes, dying destitutes, physically and mentally challenged adults men as well as women. We see to all their needs in our home.
- We also have homes for the adult women with AIDS, and shelter women in distress, in danger and abandoned pregnant women.

#### Hansen's disease Centres (Caring for the Leprosy Patients)

• We have 10 big homes for people suffering from Hansen's disease. We rehabilitate them and make them loved and wanted and see to all their needs including medical surgeries.

#### **Homes for the Children**

We have 61 Homes for abandoned, physically and mentally challenged children where we accept children with the approval of CWC, those

- Visiting prisoners in jail, poor patients in hospitals and nursing homes, Sick in the families:
- Educating street and slum children where no schools exist;
- Indoor and mobile primary healthcare facilities for first aid and general basic medicines for treatment of minor illnesses;
- Separate indoor and mobile primary healthcare facilities for treating patients with Hansen's disease;
- Temporary emergency night shelters for men and women;
- Relief centers to provide help in times of famine or other disasters;
- Centers where the hungry can receive a daily meal.
